## Endowments & Planned Giving Part 3

This is the third article about the Carmel UMC Endowment Fund. The first article focused upon the work of a newly formed Endowment Committee to develop a new Endowment Charter plus Gift Acceptance, Investment and Spending Policies for our CUMC Endowment. Our church leadership felt the need to update our old policies and create some new policies that reflect how we should care for our endowment funds. Once the policies have been approved by the Endowment Committee and the Church Governing Council, the Endowment Charter will be sent for final approval to a CUMC Charge Conference.

The second article described what Planned Giving is and how you can make a difference in the future life of Carmel UMC by considering a planned gift to the church. It mentioned the benefit we have received from our Endowment Fund by providing almost \$100,000 (over four years) toward the Making Room Capital Campaign. It spoke to many people not realizing that churches, as well as colleges/universities, hospitals and others are equipped to manage these planned gifts and want to make this giving opportunity known to its members. It provides a way for you to keep giving to our church's mission.

Now, we will tell you a little more about the current Carmel UMC Endowment Funds so you can better understand how they can make a difference in the future life of the church. The table below shows you the four major categories (e.g. undesignated/unrestricted, property/facilities, missions and donor designated accounts) of the Endowment and their respective 2016 year-end balances (rounded to nearest \$100). Collectively they add up to more than

\$685,000. The goal of any endowment fund is to preserve the principal and spend only earnings and growth each year so the funds remain and are "endowed" in perpetuity. That allows donors to know that their gifts will continue to benefit their chosen area forever. Thus, what you see as balances below are hopefully never to be spent below these current levels (or the original gift/principal). What is spent is the earnings and growth on these balances. Our funds are currently invested by the United Methodist Foundation of Indiana. Our church picks how we want to invest the funds from a limited number of mutual funds they offer that follow the goals of the Social Principles of the United Methodist Church.

### PARENT PRAYER

Kind Father, You are the Giver of all good things. You long to be gracious to me (Isaiah 30:18). I thank you for Your generosity in granting me the desires of my heart, answering my prayers, and making me glad with the joy of Your presence (Psalm 21:1-7). You pour out unending blessings, far beyond what I deserve.

Please help me to recognize that nothing I own is really mine; it is a gift from you. When I reflect on my attitude toward food and possessions, I see how often I satisfy my own desires rather than considering the needs of others. I confess that I think nothing of spending money on little extravagances, knowing full well that others elsewhere are in need of water, food and clothing. I give generously to various causes, but never to the point of significant sacrifice.

According to Your Word, selfishness and greed rank alongside sexual immorality, impurity, debauchery, idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, drunkenness, envy, murder, deceit and malice (Galatians 5:19-21, Romans 1:29). Lord, I pray that You would forgive me for the ways I have been inconsiderately selfish with the resources You have given me. I want to be generous with these blessings so I can be a blessing to others (Genesis 12:1-3). In Jesus' name, I ask that You would put to death in my life the things that belong to the sinful nature, especially greed (Colossians 3:5).

Lord, from birth I have observed in my children the human tendency to be self-centred. Please show me how I can encourage \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ to be concerned about the needs of others instead of hoarding the things You give them. Thank you that my children showed a spirit of generosity when they \_\_\_\_\_. As they are tempted to be selfish, remind them of 1 Corinthians 10:24: "Nobody should seek his own good, but the good of others." Teach them the truth of Psalm 112:5 that "Good will come to him who is generous and lends freely, who conducts his affairs with justice." I pray Your grace would abound in \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_, so they would be "... rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share" (1 Timothy 6:18).

My prayer is that generosity and grace will be hallmarks of our family so others may see You in us. Please show us who the poor and needy are in our community so we can share our wealth with them. May our generosity result in others giving thanks to You (2 Corinthians 9:8-11).

May we find joy in refreshing others by being generous with our possessions (Proverbs 11:25). You modelled true selflessness when You died on the cross. You gave Your life away. May our generous kindness to others be a testimony that You are living in us. Amen.

sympathy card from the UMW (The women's group in our church). It was a simple reminder that my new home was here in Indiana, and that there were people that care for me here.

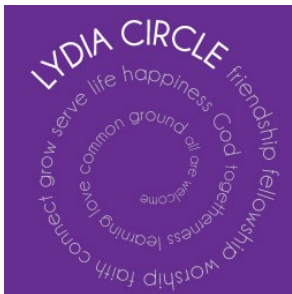
The person that wrote that note in our church was the *We Care* coordinator of UMW. This position is available now as the previous coordinator has stepped down.

## Sports & Recreation Ministry Winds Down

### - Programs Continue -



The Sports and Recreation Ministry resulted from the generous gift of one of Carmel UMC's church family members. That financial gift has been invested over the last 9 years in programs and people who have discovered a connection at Carmel UMC. The gift has now been almost entirely invested, leading the Governing Council and Pastor Patti to make the difficult decision to allow the umbrella of the Sports and Recreation Ministry to close; while recognizing that several of the programs that found their beginnings in it still have vitality. Effective April 1, 2017, the leadership and ministry of these programs will shift away from a centralized structure and ownership will rest primarily with the individual lay leaders who work with each program, with support from the church office staff as needed.

The offerings of the Sports & Recreation Ministry have recently included Adult Volleyball, Ballroom Dancing, Fitness Classes (Zumba and Yoga/Pilates) and Children's Basketball. For the foreseeable future, the adult programs will continue. The Children's Basketball program will be most impacted by the change and the possibility of future events will be contingent on significant volunteer leadership and/or a reformatting of the program under the direction of Children's Ministry. At this time, there is no formal plan for Children's Basketball to continue.

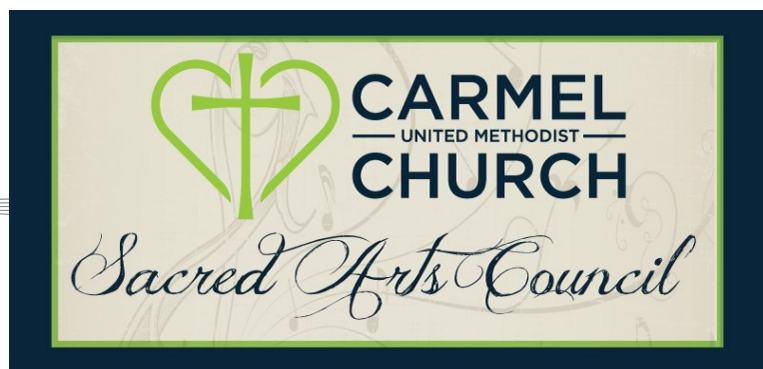
## **Brenda Williams in Concert March 18<sup>th</sup>, 7pm FLC**

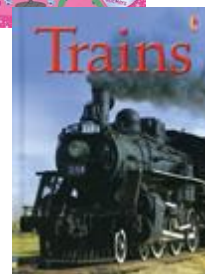
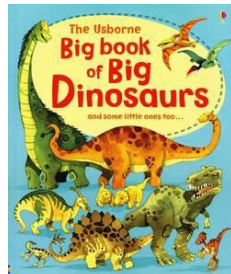
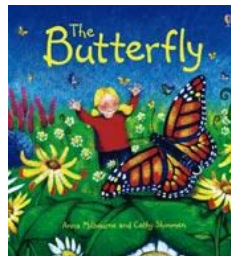

## **Henderson Settlement Family Mission Trip – 2017**

Since 2001, CUMC has been sending mission teams to Appalachia to do the Lord's work. Teams are composed men, women and youth (age 13 and above recommended) working at moderate to light construction, cleaning and painting. We are currently recruiting for this year's trip, June 11 to 17. If you have attended previous trips you are invited back. If you have not been on this trip before, or have never been on a mission trip, you are in for an experience like none other.

The cost to you is a week of your time and \$250 per person (family maximum is \$500). For that you get three scrumptious meals per day, free evening programs and entertainment, group devotion time, air conditioned dormitories, spacious private shower and restroom facilities, free Wi-Fi, a free T-shirt and the privilege of working with fellow Christians on projects that help people in need.
