How Jesus Made Disciples

When you hear the word "discipleship" what comes to mind?

- curriculum?
- programs?
- classes?

Curriculum, programs, nor classes make disciples. Disciples make disciples. That is why *disciplemaking* is so important for the work of the church.

Jesus is our model. He coached, taught, mentored, modeled, and spent time with those first disciples.

"Whoever claims to live in him must live as Jesus did." 1 John 2:6

And then Jesus passed the mission on and gave us our mission:

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. An surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:19-20

We are to be *disciple-makers*.

Disciplemaking is the full circle process of seeing people come to faith in Christ, grow in Him, and then be equipped to go back and help others repeat this process.

Disciplemaking is more than discipleship which usually defines how to help believers grow. *Disciplemaking* is "winning the lost" (I Cor 9:19), "growing the believer" (Col 2:6-7) an "equipping the worker (Eph 4:12). **Disciplemaking** is a relational process of helping people to follow Jesus and be like Him. It is recognizing that people are at different stages of spiritual development and then responding appropriately to share with them. That is how we grow the number of disciples in this world.

Jesus told us a parable, or story, to illustrate this process using the vine as a visual. Jesus is the vine and we are the branches. The branches are to bear fruit. As Christians when we learn and serve, we have a purpose beyond that learning moment for just ourselves. We are called to share in a way that will bear fruit for others.

Can you think of someone who impacted your life as a *disciplemaker*? Maybe take time to share your thanks.

Can you be a *disciplemaker* yourself. I happen to believe all of us are called.

"A student in the ESL program at Carmel UMC had a relative killed in the recent bus massacre of

Christians in Egypt. The young man was about 26 years old. Also killed in the shooting was a 3-year old child, in addition to about 25 other innocent people. Just another reminder that, although we have problems in our own country, we are very blessed to freely attend church , to speak and write about our religious beliefs, & to choose the church we want to attend, etc. Worshipping and studying God's word are great freedoms we often take for granted. We are so blessed that we are often unaware of what great riches we have. We complain about rainy days until we experience a drought.

Please feel free to remind me next time you hear me complain about something trivial."

WHAT IS YOUR JOURNEY OF THE MOMENT?

They will laugh with you, cry with you, and sit quietly with you if that is what you need. You will share with them and they will share with you. You will find comfort in their care because they will not judge you or tell you what you "should" do. They are simply here to care for you.

IN TH<mark>e spotlight</mark>: Hugh <mark>Wolf</mark>

This is the fourth in a monthly series for the Contact entitled "In The Spotlight," where I interview members of our church who helped bring us to where we are today. You might say they are the bedrock upon which we have continually built our programming, outreach, missions, etc. As Minister of Visitation, I have felt the need to share with the congregation many of the memories our senior members have shared with me.

Hugh came into the world on June 26th, 1931 in Indianapolis.

He started his education at John Strange Grade School in Indianapolis. He later attended Broad Ripple High School, graduating in 1949, where he lettered in basketball and baseball.

Following graduation from Broad Ripple, Hugh attended Butler University, graduating in 1953 with a Bachelor of Science in Education. While at Butler, he won letters in baseball. Hugh recalls that Tony Hinkle was his baseball coach when he was a catcher. Subsequently the Chicago Cubs drafted him into their Minor League farm system.

In September of 1953, Hugh and Val were married. Later in 1953 he was drafted into the U.S. Army, and while in the Army, was stationed at Hanau, Germany where he played baseball.

During Hugh's enlistment, Val, traveled to Germany to be with him. They have been blessed with three children, Gregg, Bruce and Karen and are proud grandparents of six grandchildren.

As an aside, he jokingly recalled that when he went overseas to his tour of duty in Europe, he sailed on the *General Alexander Patch*. But on his return to the States, he sailed on the *Private William E*. *Thomas*. Hugh said it was just a step above a kayak.

After his tour in the Army, he was honorably discharged in 1955, at which time Hugh returned to Butler where he received his master's degree in Education. Subsequently, he earned a doctoral degree from IU.

Hugh's career in education began in 1955 with IPS at Harry E. Wood High School where he taught history and was a guidance counselor. In 1958 he transferred to Howe High School and taught World History and was Dean of Boys. Hugh shared humorous memories about his encounters with many of the male students, but preferred not to elaborate for this article.

In 1961 Hugh went to work at the Purdue Regional Campus which at that time was located on East 38th Street near the Indiana State Fair grounds.

It was during this period that IUPUI was formed, and for 19 years he was a Dean in the School of Education, and later, Dean of Students. Hugh's love of athletics led him to become Athletic Director at IUPUI for five years, during which time he championed NCAA Division I ranking for IUPUI in all sports.

After an illustrious career in education, and many, many accomplishments and awards, too numerous to mention in this article, he retired in 1996. We thank him for his life of service to our youth where he planted many, many seeds in those lives for the betterment of our world.

Val and he moved to Carmel in 1971 and joined CUMC in 1973. While at CUMC, Hugh has served on the Pastor/Parish Committee, (Chairman numerous times), where there were many very important decisions to be made, sometimes very difficult decisions, resulting in the improvement and upward growth of our mission to *Connect, Grow* and *Serve*. His leadership, guidance, and expertise in human relations, served us all very well in that most position at CUMC.

Hugh's civic accomplishments are many: His involvement with the Carmel Classic and Chairman of the Track and Field event where teams from across the U.S. came here to Compete. He served on the Carmel Clay Library Board for 16 years and was instrumental in creating the present library building. He currently is a member of the Carmel Clay Building Corporation.

Last, but not at all least, his devotion to God and his fellow men and women. We thank you for your life of service.

Presently, Hugh and Val reside at Sunrise on Old Meridian.
