Traditions have always been an important part of my life. As I put away my Christmas decorations this year (I assume most people have. I think I am late with this. I took mine down Jan. 15) I also put away those holiday traditions...until next year. But, wait! traditions don't only happen once a year...there are other beautiful traditions throughout the year!

A tradition of the church calendar, which I have always loved is the season of Lent. More and more I find people have forgotten much about this faith tradition. I hope that perhaps you will consider starting a tradition for the season, if this is not worship as we launch the Lent series titled "Death to already a part of your life.

Consider the tradition of preparing for Lent, by joining Carmel UMC on Tuesday, Feb. 13 in the Family Life Center for the Boy Scout's annual Pancake Supper as we celebrate Fat Tuesday Finally consider planning to never forget the Holy (French word is Mardi Gras). The tradition of Fat Tuesday came as everyone is supposed to clear from their kitchen ingredients that are used to prepare rich, fatty foods that will be abstained from (fasting from) during the 40 days of Lent. Over the years that has been symbolized by eating pancakes.

**season of Lent**, Ash Wednesday, which is the following day, this year on February 14th. The season of Lent is a 40-day period (not including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday. It is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. A time of self-examination and reflection. We launch this period on Ash Wednesday through worship which includes the imposition of ashes on your forehead or hand symbolizing your desire to be forgiven for your sins and being willing to make changes that will bring you closer to Christ.

Consider making this day a part of your tradition:

• Drive-thru ashes will be shared from 6-9 am

- Lunch-time service where ashes will be shared in a 30-minute service
- Evening service for children and adults at 6:30 pm. Childcare available

Throughout Lent, consider a tradition of study. A book study of "Shadow of a Galilean" will be led by Minister of Adult Discipleship, Chris Thornsberry throughout the Lenten season. You can either join online or in person.

Consider a tradition to participate in weekly Selfie." We will look within our lives to find that there are little "lies" in every selfie and it is those little "lies" than can sometime keep us from a right relationship with Jesus.

Week experiences of Palm Sunday (March 25), Holy Thursday (Thursday, March 29), Good Friday (Friday, March 30) and finally culminating with Easter on April 1 (and that is no fooling!).

I have long said that the season of Lent and Easter are my favorite times, as those are times where I Then consider the tradition that launches the 40-day have really felt challenged to grow in my faith. I hope that you will find the same and will invest your heart and time!!!







- Our missions are very active and they do make a big impact on others. We'd like to recognize that there
  were numerous times in the 2017 year where people in our church and the missions that they represent
  quietly went above and beyond what was expected. These actions were all done for others for the love
  of Christ Jesus Our Savior.
  - A homeless man who left Wheeler Mission and we helped to get settled into an apartment, this very same man comes back to serve in our missions.
  - A lady who was in desperate circumstances, we were able to completely furnish her apartment and we have brought food to her on several occasions too.
  - A disabled single Mom who has 3 sons and was in desperate need when her car was in need of repairs including her brakes. This is the only car they have to get to food pantries and to the pharmacy. We were able to get the car repaired and make it road worthy and safe again.
  - We were able to help an IHN family who was getting established in a new home when they had car repair issues. We covered the tow and the repairs so that the Dad could have transportation to maintain his new job.
  - We had members who helped 3 different IHN families at Christmas.
  - We were able to work with our preschool and provide Christmas gifts to many of the children who visit our Food Pantry.
  - Our folks stepped up and helped the efforts of the Carmel lunch program for kids right here in the Carmel Clay School System who might not get lunch in the summer or on holiday breaks.
  - There were a few Angel Tree families who had children with no coats, Kids Coats partnered with us and got them coats in addition to their Angel Tree gifts.
  - We linked up with a single Mom in our Angel Tree program who had never had a Christmas tree
    in her entire life. She and her kids were overjoyed when they received a tree, lights and
    ornaments that they can use for years ahead now.




# Save the date: VBS is June 24-28 Shipwrecked VBS: Rescued by Jesus.
